We exist to help our patients achieve the best quality of life possible in whatever time remains for them. Where it may not be possible to add days to lives, we aim to add life to days.

As a registered charity, care is free of charge. The hospice depends on the generosity of you, our supporters, to raise the £3million in voluntary donations that is required to maintain our invaluable services for the people of Glasgow.

Every year we offer care for 1200 patients and families who require the best possible quality of care. Our main aim is to provide comfort and peace of mind for everyone involved. We support patients both in the hospice through our inpatient unit, outpatient clinics and day services as well as in the community, in the patient's home or in hospital.

At the centre of hospice care is supporting people to live as well as possible for as long as possible.



The Hospice



A green site at the bottom of a gently sloping hill in Glasgow's Bellahouston Park is the location of The Prince & Princess of Wales Hospice.

Our patients and families



When Leona Davidson was 10 she was diagnosed with the rare pantothenate kinase-associated neurodegeneration, formerly called Hallervorden-Spatz Disease. One of only two people in the country who suffer from the fatal genetic disorder, she is now 27 years old and a new patient transitioning from Children's Hospices Across Scotland (CHAS) to age-appropriate adult services at The Prince & Princess of Wales Hospice.

Once a lively child, filled with infectious enthusiasm for life, Leona is now in a wheelchair and can only communicate through a computerized speech board.

She doesn't let that get in the way of enjoying life, as her mum Angela explains. And as anyone can see who meets her and sees her beautiful smile: "Leona has a busy life, she's out and about with friends all the time, she has her own car and her own care staff. She meets up with friends and goes to the cinema, she loves pretty clothes, make-up and pop music," she says.

"I'm a lone parent, I have a full-time job, I have a son at home and have Leona's needs to oversee. It does get tiring. To have the support of the hospice is fantastic."

Angela and Leona now work closely with Fiona Wylie, The Prince & Princess of Wales Hospice's Joint Clinical Services Director.

"Fiona has organised Leona's therapies, so she's at the hospice once a week getting facials, manicures and pedicures. Fiona has also provided great emotional support with calls just to touch base and ask how things are. That gives us a lot of comfort," says Angela.

"Everything that the hospice said would happen has happened. They haven't let us down."

How your money helps

£10 can pay for a patient's meals for a day, made in the hospice by our catering team

£60 can fund a patient's specialist assessment by our rehabilitation team who support symptom control

£160 can run an ambulance for a day, providing more access to hospice services for patients

£270 can fund a community nurse for a day, providing care and support for patients, families and carers **£270**

funds our Arts service for a day, providing a supportive environment where people can express themselves and develop creativity

£360 provides for a block of 6 counselling sessions for patients families and/or their carers

£1,800 can run the Living Well Hub for a day, providing activities that support well-being

£11,760 can run run our inpatient unit for a day

The money you raise helps thousands of patients and their families each year in our inpatient unit, through our day services, complementary therapies and art project as well as out in the community.

With your help, we can help children and young people cope with bereavement through our Family Support Service. Supporting families and carers is so important here at the hospice. We know that when a loved one is seriously unwell, it can take its toll on them and you can help us provide practical, emotional, spiritual and psychological support.

CHALLENGE HINTS & TIPS

Make sure you give yourself plenty of time to train - particularly if you are doing something physically demanding such as climbing a munro or running a marathon.

Get all of your friends and family involved - you could organise a finishing party at the end to celebrate your achievement and raise a few last-minute pounds.

DON'T FORGET TO giftaid it

Make sure to ask all those eligible to select Gift Aid when donating. This means we can claim back at least 25p for every £1 donated. We will not use donors details for any other purpose than to claim back Gift Aid.

Fundraise at work

- Organise a day to donate in your office - bring along any unwanted clothes, furniture, jewellery to your work place and arrange to have it dropped off at one of our hospice shops.
- Have a cake bake competition at work - who can make the biggest, best and wackiest cake?



Already have a dress down friday? Why not don your glad rags and have a dress-up day?

Fundraise at school

- Try a sponsored silence for the day
- Have a onesie day pupils and teachers dress up in their onsies or jammies - a right comfy day.
- Hold a mini Olympic games. Mix the long jump with the egg and spoon for a twist on the school sports day.

CELEBRATION DONATION

Got a big birthday coming up? Getting married? You could ask your guests to give a celebration donation to the hospice. Ask us about wedding favours.

Do you sing in a choir? Fancy singing for the hospice? Hold a concert in your local shopping centre and raise money. Are you a dab hand at gift wrapping? You could set up shop in your local community hall or shopping centre and wrap Christmas presents for a donation. The hospice can supply offical buckets or cans for your event, just get in touch.



PICK SOMETHING FUN TO DO

Keep it simple. Sometimes the best ideas are the simplest.

SET A DATE

Make sure it is realistic. Work backwards and set a timeline of everything you need to do.

WRITE A PLAN AND KEEP IT UPDATED

Allow enough time for any travel, accommodation or suppliers to be booked.



CHOOSE YOUR VENUE CAREFULLY

Can it hold enough people? Do you need an alcohol licence?



PUBLICISE YOUR EVENT

Use our press release template to tell the media about your fabulous event. You can use our poster templates to help advertise.

6. TELL US ABOUT IT

Doing something unusual? Tell us about it. We may be able to help publicise it on our social media pages. We can also provide you with cans, buckets and t-shirts.

TELL EVERYONE ABOUT IT

Social media is a great way of telling a lot of people about your event instantly. You can create a Facebook event page and invite all of your family and friends to join it.

GET FRIENDS AND LOCAL COMMUNITY GROUPS INVOLVED

Fundraising events are a great way to bring people in your community together.

9.

MAXIMISE YOUR DONATIONS

Some employers might match your fundraising total.

- Set up a JustGiving page. Sharing the link with everyone you know makes it easier for people to donate.
- Ask your donors to choose Gift Aid to help boost your total. For every £1 you raise we will be able to claim 25p.

10. KEEP TRACK OF YOUR TOTAL

Send back your total now you've done all the hard work raising money for the hospice, send back your total using the fundraisers donation form at the back of the pack.







Posters

Use our templates - you can pin them on local noticeboards and put them up in shop windows. Contact the fundraising team to get yours today.

Write a blog

There are loads of free hosting websites out there. These are great if you are training for a challenge event. You can keep your donors and supporters updated with your training and progress.

Social media tips and PR guidance

LOCAL PRESS	Talking to local press is a great way to raise awareness of your event and why you are raising money. Local newspapers are always looking for good local stories.
PRESS RELEASE	Use our press release template - send it out to local press. You will find contact details on the internet.
	Top tip: always follow up the press release with a phone call. Ask them if they would like to cover your event, you never know!
SOCIAL MEDIA	Whatever you choose to do for the hospice, make sure to share and share again on social media. Tweet about it, get your friends to retweet it, post it on Facebook and create an event page. Spread the message!

Publicising your event



Keep it legal

YOU WILL NEED TO OBTAIN A LICENCE FROM YOUR LOCAL AUTHORITY IF YOU PLAN ON

- Carrying out a street bucket/can collection.
- Having a bar at your event. (check with your local authority well in advance to see how long this process takes. Some need a minimum of four weeks' notice which means it could take longer).

RAFFLES

If you hold a small raffle on the day of your activity you do not need a licence so long as ticket sales and the draw take place during the main event. Make it clear who is running the raffle. Check out the latest information on **gamblingcommission.gov.uk**

FOOD HYGIENE

Food safety laws will apply when food is available, whether for sale or not. Contact your local council for more information if you plan on offering food at your event. Visit **food.gov.uk** for more information.

RISK ASSESSMENTS

Identify any hazards and assess any risks at your event that you may need to consider (eg children in bar areas, etc). Ask the venue manager for assistance.

MAKE SURE YOUR VENUE HAS PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE

Ask the venue manager for assistance.

HEALTH AND SAFETY EXECUTIVE

If you have any concerns about health and safety at your event, visit hse.gov.uk

IF YOU ARE PLANNING AN OUTDOOR EVENT

You may need to check if you require security. Contact Police Scotland for more information **police.scotland.gov.uk**

DATE

PRESS RELEASE – FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

WRITE YOUR HEADLINE HERE IN UPPER CASE – MAKE IT EYE CATCHING TO GRAB ATTENTION

The first paragraph should be a summary of the story in one to two sentences. Remember to include who, what, where, when, why and how.

The second paragraph expands on the details above. Give specific details of your event, things of interest that will grab the journalist's attention. Perhaps you have a celebrity coming along? Or you are trying to break a record? The journalist will be looking for something unique that will appeal to readers. Include details of why you are choosing to donate to The Prince & Princess of Wales Hospice. Include quotes if you can from a key person that will help bring your story to life.

The final paragraph tells people what you want them to do, for example buy tickets, register, sponsor. Give details of your fundraising page or any other websites you are using to promote your event. If you have an online donation facility, include that here too.


